Troodos Mountains / Mount Olympus Worksheet

Guidelines for educators

- Context and the area of cultural heritage: natural cultural heritage in Cyprus
- Description and justification: The Troodos Mountain (Mt) is the second largest state forest in Cyprus and is at the highest altitude of the island (1,952 meters). Mt. Olympus consists of precious rock formations and has been extensively studied by scientists for its geomorphology. It also allows for important studies of oceanic crustal and mantle sequences. The mountain forms a geopark which consists of nature trails that are a must visit when in Cyprus.
- Duration: 45 minutes
- Language level: A2
- Age group (this should be defined only in case where certain exercises were created for a certain age group): 12-18 years old
- Prior knowledge: basic vocabulary about animals, ability to read and understand simple sentences and frequently used expressions, important signs and symbols related to directions, introduction to prepositions of place, knowledge of past and present tenses (simple, continuous & perfect), introduction to future tenses (simple).
- Thematic area, grammatical and syntactical phenomena (learning objectives):

In this worksheet students will learn:

- Mountain vocabulary (including animals)
- Reading comprehension
- Practice using present simple, continuous and perfect tenses
- Practice using past simple, continuous and perfect tenses



- Practice using future simple tenses
- Practical uses of prepositions of place for giving directions

Skills developed (or benefits for students):

At the end of this worksheet, students will:

- Gain increased ability to talk about the mountains
- Learn about one of the most important natural heritage sites in Cyprus
- Learn how to give directions using prepositions of place
- Enrich their vocabulary about mountain animals and mountain exercises
- Practice their oral skills learn to share experiences, explain something using justifications, etc.
- Practice their reading comprehension skills with mixed tenses
